August Primary / Who – When – and Where

Who can vote in the Primary?

US Citizens who are registered can participate in voting. *Note: Former Norfolk residents who are US Citizens should contact the Town Clerk's office to determine eligibility*

Voter Registration for Early Voting:

- **Persons registered in a major party (Republican, Democrat) may vote in a Primary**
- **New Voters:** 12:00pm the day before a person wishes to vote during Early Voting
- **Unaffiliated Voters:** must file application with the Registrar of Voters by 12:00 pm, Friday July 31 to change party affiliation to a major party to vote during the Early Voting period
- 17-year-olds who will be 18 years old by Election Day (November 3, 2026) are eligible to vote during the early voting period

When can I vote?

***ABSENTEE VOTING:** July 21, 2026 – August 10, 2026

Tuesday, August 4, 2026, 8:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m.
Wednesday, August 5, 2026, 10:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.
Thursday, August 6, 2026, 8:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m.
Friday, August 7, 2026, 10:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.
Saturday, August 8, 2026, 10:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.
Sunday, August 9, 2026, 10:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.

ELECTION DAY VOTING: Tuesday, August 11, 2026, 6:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m.

****EARLY VOTING:** Town Hall Upstairs, 19 Maple Avenue, Norfolk, CT 06058

ELECTION DAY VOTING: Town Hall Upstairs, 19 Maple Avenue, Norfolk, CT 06058

Town Hall Same Day Registration/Voting-for those who are not registered and wish to register and vote in person on Election Day
